CONDITIONS ATTACHED TO THE OFFER OF A GRANT

1. The work must have received all necessary approvals from regulatory bodies before the work begins. For Anglican churches a faculty or archdeacon's certificate is required.
2. The PCC will become a member of FKC, if it is not already one.
3. A poster and a membership application form (supplied by FKC) will be displayed in the church when the work is complete.
4. We will pay the grant when we receive a copy of an architect's certificate for part of the work exceeding the value of the grant. If you do not have an architect supervising the work, an equivalent proof that work to the value of the grant has been done satisfactorily should be agreed with the secretary.
5. Grant offers are initially valid for two years. If you have not claimed your grant in that time, the offer will be reviewed and may be withdrawn if the project is not proceeding.
6. When the work is done, a short piece will be inserted in the Parish Magazine acknowledging the grant and publicising the work of FKC. It should cover:
 - Amount of the grant and the work it contributed to
 - That FKC have been contributing to the maintenance of Churches of architectural merit or historic importance in Kent for 65 years
 - That FKC rely on fund raising (mainly the Ride & Stride) and members subscriptions and legacies
 - That members may join by contacting the membership secretary, or by filling in an application form
